The Sisters-Camp Sherman Fire District (SCSFD) is seeking applicants for the position of Firefighter/Paramedic. Serving in a progressive and dynamic, full-service fire and EMS organization means that our Firefighter/Paramedics get the opportunity to serve in emergency response, training, and community service roles.

Firefighter/Paramedics also serve in the role of engineer (apparatus operator) when all qualifications are achieved (NFPA Driver/Apparatus Equipped with Fire Pump/Mobile Water Supply Apparatus/Wildland Operator).

This recruitment is intended to fill one immediate opening, and establish an entrance register that will endure for up to 36-months.

About the District

The Sisters-Camp Sherman Rural Fire Protection District provides a full-range of emergency services to a diverse service area of approximately 55 square miles of fire protection and an Ambulance Service Area of approximately 800 square miles. The District is composed of career, volunteer, and resident volunteer firefighters, as well as a Fire Corps community support program. The District responds to roughly 1300 calls per year with 80% of requests for service being medical in nature. Much of the District is located within the Wildland Urban Interface which has a significant wildland fire history.

The District is heavily involved in community events such as the Sisters Rodeo, the Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show, and the Sisters Folk Festival. The region is well known for our year-round outdoor recreational opportunities.

SCSFD has a training partnership with Hampshire and Isle of Wight Fire and Rescue Service in the UK in which staff members of each organization participate in an operational exchange program. SCSFD firefighter/paramedics participate in this program.

- Must meet minimum physical and mental functions and must pass an annual physical ability test and/or medical evaluation.
- Must be able to successfully pass a District physical exam and drug test when required.
